

International Intercultural Cities Comparative Study

EVENT REPORT

Montréal, Québec, Canada (September 15, 2022)

I. Description of the event : Montreal Round-Table

A one-day roundtable was organized in Montreal (Canada) to revisit the ideas put forward at the workshops on the intercultural approach held in Sherbrooke (Canada), Sabadell (Spain), Ballarat and Salisbury (Australia) in the preceding months. This event served to bring together municipal and community actors working in the field of immigration and culturally diverse communities, who are called upon to put into practice one or more diversity management models.

The morning of the roundtable day was used to present the preliminary results of the International Intercultural Cities Comparative Study of the participating cities by the regional researchers. Participants were then given the opportunity to ask questions to better understand the deployment of the Intercultural City model. In the afternoon, two subgroups, respectively representatives of Quebec cities that are members of the *Réseau des municipalités en immigration et en relations interculturelles* (RÉMIRI) and practitioners from the *Montréal Ville Interculturelle* (MVIC) partnership, were scheduled to discuss intercultural policies and practices and to reflect collectively on the international coordination of actions. However, due to a lower participation rate than expected, the researchers chose to bring together all roundtable participants and hold a discussion that included city representatives and practitioners. The result was a dynamic and interesting conversation about the implementation of intercultural practices and policies, the different issues each faced, impressions and ideas leading to more concerted municipal action, and more. At the end of the day's roundtable, all participants had the opportunity to learn about the Intercultural Cities model and were able to express their different realities.
